Family Fun Day & Markets in The Trees A St Luke's Fundraiser: Saturday 7th September 9-2pm

In last week's Together we provided you with an update on what the day will look like - stalls, entertainment, activities and markets. This week we have outlined how you can help this day be a wonderful event for our church and local community.

Needed - before the day:

- Using a provided list, someone to order and collect a bulk number of sausages, bread and onions on Friday 6th or early on Saturday 7th for the BBQ stall.
- ii. A few more people to add their names to help on a stall on the day. - The Kids Zone activities and BBQ (serving) have the most spots to fill.

iii. Donations:

- Items for the Kids Biz stall toys, books, games, puzzles etc. Please drop in to the Pre-School during opening hours or place in the box provided in St Luke's gathering area.
- * Flat cardboard or plastic containers for kids to transport/take home their finished Plaster of Paris items approx. 10cm x 10cm or bigger. Recycled plastic meat containers are ideal so pleased start collecting them and place them in the box provided.
- * Homecrafts new homemade items. If you crochet, see the provided towels and cottons in the basket in the gathering area for you to take home and complete and return prior to the day.
- * Home cooking: some can be made ahead of time and freeze if need be. Cakes, biscuits, slices, sweets, jams, pickles, chutney etc. Always a very popular stall!

The Markets in the Trees component of the day will be 29 stalls set up on the grassy area at the top of the car park (adjacent to Narla) Church or community members can book a stall at a cost of \$50 each . To sell new or second hand items. Bookings for the stalls are



now open on the trybooking site and close on 1 September (or until sold out). More details on the flyer.
