Presbytery Prayer Diary

This week's Presbytery Prayer Point is New Lambton Trinity Uniting Church

The New Lambton Uniting Church has a regular congregation of about 50 people with an intergenerational worship service each Sunday morning. Our new minister, Rev Mitch Forbes and his previous congregation, the New City Church, worship separately in our church building, but we share fellowship over morning tea each Sunday morning. At present, Rev Mitch is leading both congregations. We have a Children and Youth Worker, Bec Westphal, who runs Kids' Club, meeting every alternate Friday night. Our Youth Worker, Mel Langi, runs a high school aged youth group with 18-20 attendees, on alternate Friday nights, and Mel also assists in our Sunday worship. We also join with Jesmond Uniting Church on alternate Saturday nights for Faith@5, an intergenerational worship service, where children and youth play an important role. This is followed by a shared dinner. Our craft group involves members who are not involved with our church in any other way. There are a number of new initiatives being developed to engage our wider community.

Prayer: We pray for openness, flexibility and grace as NLUC and New City Congregation transition into our new arrangements. We pray for our Kids Club and Youth Group members, that they will grow, both spiritually and emotionally, and that their leaders will be blessed with energy to share Gods message and love. We Pray for our community initiatives, that they will be a blessing to all, and that New Lambton UC will be put in touch with those that we can support. We pray for the further close relationship between our older and younger members, and the involvement of our adult members in the running of Kids Club and Youth Group. We pray for our Church Executive, some of whom have worked tirelessly over the past 2 years while we were without ordained ministry. Amen.

Two Kinds of Wisdom

Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. Such "wisdom" does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness.

Submit Yourselves to God

What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You desire but do not have, so you kill. You covet but you cannot get what you want, so you quarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.

You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity against God?

Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. Or do you think Scripture says without reason that he jealously longs for the spirit he has caused to dwell in us? But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says:

"God opposes the proud but shows favour to the humble."

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Come near to God and he will come near to you.
