## **Presbytery Prayer Diary**

This diary provides an opportunity to pray each week for congregations in the Presbytery. By praying together, we can encourage one another in mission, as we grow in faith and unity and develop understanding and relationships across the region.

#### This week's Presbytery Prayer Point is Scone Uniting Church

Scone Congregation includes the rural worship centres of Scone, Rouchel and Bunnan. The Scone Uniting Church meets each Sunday at 9:30am with approximately 25-35 people in attendance. Rouchel has an average attendance of 2-8 people who meet for a monthly service. Bunnan has just begun to meet after a 3-year hiatus. The Scone congregation is an aging congregation but welcomes a number of Asian and Pacific Islander worshippers who are employed locally. On a weekly basis, there is a Monday Bible Study group, a Tuesday Open Door coffee morning, and a Saturday English Language Conversation class. The Pacific Islander (Pasifika) attendees also hold regular services, mostly on Saturday evenings in conjunction with a Brazilian church.

**Prayer:** We pray for the members of all worship centres and their families. May the centres of worship be places of welcome and hospitality in their communities. We pray for God's guidance for all who lead us and may they be faithful to God and to His Word. We also pray that we will be open to God's leading in this changing world, and that we will be sensitive to opportunities in the path forward regarding Mission and Ministry, and the use of our properties and other resources. #### James 5:13-20 NIV

#### The Prayer of Faith

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops. My brothers and sisters, if one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring that person back, remember this: Whoever turns a sinner from the error of their way will save them from death and cover over a multitude of sins.

#### Mark 9:38-50 NIV

#### Whoever Is Not Against Us Is for Us

"Teacher," said John, "we saw someone driving out demons in your name and we told him to stop, because he was not one of us."

"Do not stop him," Jesus said. "For no one who does a miracle in my name can in the next moment say anything bad about me, for whoever is not against us is for us. Truly I tell you, anyone who gives you a cup of water in my name because you belong to the Messiah will certainly not lose their reward.

#### Causing to Stumble

"If anyone causes one of these little ones—those who believe in me—to stumble, it would be better for them if a large millstone were hung around their neck and they were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go into hell, where the fire never goes out. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life crippled than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye causes you to stumble, pluck it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell, where "'the worms that eat them do not die, and the fire is not quenched.'

Everyone will be salted with fire.

"Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can you make it salty again? Have salt among yourselves, and be at peace with each other."
