

5 Congratulations

Congratulations to Rev Tom Anderson who is celebrating fifty years since his Ordination . We give thanks to God for Tom's ministry over the past fifty years and we are especially thankful



for the ministry and friendship that he offers to St Luke's in his retirement years. Tom has served the church as follows;

Tom candidated for the ministry and was accepted by the NSW Methodist Conference in 1969.

From 1970-1973 Tom was undertook Theological Education and ministerial formation at Leigh College, Enfield and United Faculty of Theology, St Andrew's College within the University of Sydney and with his Circuit experience program at Loftus in 1971 – 72. He was a Graduate of the Melbourne College of Divinity.

Tom was appointed to the Forster-Wallamba Joint Parish where he served from 1974 – 1979. Tom was Ordained on 13th October 1974 at Leigh Memorial Church, Parramatta.

Tom served in the Mayfield Parish from 1980-1984, at Port Stephens from 1985-1993, Reid Parish (Canberra) 1994-1999, Milton-Ulladulla Parish from 2000-2007 where he retired on 30th June 2007 and moved to Belmont North.

Tom has exercised ministry in a wide variety of ways over the years and one of these areas was Chaplaincy. He was a Chaplain at Thredbo with the landslide and at Nyngan with the floods. At Milton-Ulladulla he was Chaplain to the SES which then led him to being a volunteer as well as Chaplain. He continued as a volunteer with the SES at Lake Macquarie after he retired and moved to Belmont.

We give thanks to God for Tom's long and faithful ministry and our prayers go with him as he continues to serve God in ministry in his retirement.

It is hoped that members of St Lukes will support this activity, especially the men who will be joining with community participants should they attend.


If there is enough interest golf, croquet, darts and Finska will also be organised at future dates.

Hebrews 5:1-10 NIV

Every high priest is selected from among the people and is appointed to represent the people in matters related to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness. This is why he has to offer sacrifices for his own sins, as well as for the sins of the people. And no one takes this honour on himself, but he receives it when called by God, just as Aaron was.

In the same way, Christ did not take on himself the glory of becoming a high priest. But God said to him,

"You are my Son; today I have become your Father."

And he says in another place,

"You are a priest forever,
in the order of Melchizedek."

During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 10:35-45 NIV

The Request of James and John

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him.

"Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."

"What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.

They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."

"You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

"We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."

When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
